

FORT MCALLISTER

Fort McAllister was built by Confederates on the right bank of the Great Ogeechee River in 1861-62 to protect the southwestern flank of Savannah and the rice plantations along the river. This massive earthwork fort withstood several Union naval attacks by armored vessels, but was captured on December 13, 1864, by the land forces of General W.T. Sherman. The Confederate major reported: "The fort was never surrendered. It was captured by overwhelming numbers." Sherman had completed his famed march to the sea and not long afterwards he presented Savannah as a Christmas gift to President Lincoln. The fort was first restored by Henry Ford in 1938 and has been maintained since 1958 by the Parks and Historic Sites Division of the Georgia Department of Natural Resources.


