NUCLEAR SHIP SAVANNAH

The N. S. Savannah, the world's first nuclear-powered cargo-passenger ship, is the namesake of the famous SS SAVANNAH, the first steamship to cross the Atlantic ocean, in 1819. Home port of the 22,000 ton vessel, is Savannah, Georgia. She is 595 1/2 feet long, has a normal cruising speed of 20 knots, carries 60 passengers, a crew of 110 and about 10,000 tons of dry cargo and cost some \$47,000,000. The N. S. SAVANNAH, a joint project of the Atomic Energy Commission and the Maritime Administration of the U. S. Department of Commerce, in her voyages to world ports symbolizes America's peaceful use of the mighty atom.


NUCLEAR SHIP SAVANNAH

World's first nuclear-powered merchant ship, the sleek N. S. SAVANNAH travels to ports of the world as an example of the peaceful uses of atomic energy. Carrying up to 60 passengers and 10,000 tons of cargo, she can operate at cruising speed for 3 1/2 years without refueling. N. S. SAVANNAH was built as a joint project of the Maritime Administration, U. S. Department of Commerce, and the Atomic Energy Commission, and is operated by American Export-Isbrandtsen Lines as the General Agent. Her length is 595 ft . . . cruising speed 21 knots . . . full load displacement of 21,850 tons.




