

WESLEY'S CHAPEL LONDON WESLEY'S HOUSE


In 1779 John Wesley, who had lodged previously in the premises of his first chapel, the Foundery, came to this typical 18thC house in the City Road alongside his new chapel which had been opened the year before. Wesley's rooms, where he lived and

where he died in 1791, were on the first floor. The other rooms were used as lodgings for Wesley's preachers.






WESLEY'S CHAPEL LONDON

John Wesley was buried in 1791 in the little graveyard behind his Chapel, a site he had chosen himself. "I particularly desire," he wrote, "there may be no hearse, no coach, no escutcheon, no pomp, except the tears of those that loved me." The funeral

WESLEY'S TOMB

was held by torchlight at dawn because it was feared that unmanageable crowds would have flocked to a day-time burial.



Methodism. Charles Wesley, writer of over 6,000 hymns.







WESLEY'S CHAPEL LONDON ENTRANCE COURTYARD


John Wesley (1703-1791) laid the foundation stone of his chapel in East London in 1777. It is not far from the site of his first chapel, founded in 1739 in a disused Moorfields foundery. The new chapel was described by Wesley as 'perfectly neat but

not fine'. The portico was added in 1815. The statue by Adams-Acton was erected in 1891 to commemorate the centenary of the death of Wesley.




WESLEY'S CHAPEL, CITY ROAD, LONDON, WESLEY'S PRAYER ROOM

This room, where John Wesley prayed alone - only God is here. The table, chair and read his Bible each morning and night, has been called the Prayer House and candlestick all belonged to Wesley. of Methuen, he said: "Here I sit, for from the busy cares of men, I sit down"

WESLEY'S CHAPEL LONDON THE INTERIOR

Wesley's Chapel - "the Cathedral of Methodism" - was opened for worship in 1778. A fire in 1879 did serious damage to the roof and galleries and much of the furniture, but Wesley's pulpit, at that time a "three decker" including the pulpit,

lectern and prayer desk, was scarcely touched. The chapel was restored so as to reproduce all the features of the original.
