Dear Mrs. Roberts:

The work is progressing nicely at the Andrew Bryan burial site in Laurel Grove Cemetery, South. Mr. Franklin B. Bevens told me that you were able to visit the site during my absence at noon. I was able to spend most of the day with Mr. Bevens, and Mr. Cyrus Green and his son, Tony, who worked on the brick work.

May I suggest that Clifford E. Hardwick III, as a committee member, be asked to work at the cemetery with Mr. Bevens on Saturday. They begin at 8:00 a.m. If he can not help, perhaps he can get someone in his stead. I will give sometime, also.

Mr. Bevens had to pay Mr. Green and his son the sum of forty-five dollars for their services on last Saturday. Mr. Bevens paid them cash, and we reimbursed him with a check. It seems to me that you might want to set a fund that Mr. Bevens can draw upon or you might anticipate his financial needs, and we draw the checks in advance.

The other day, I had to pay cash for building material from Bremer Supply Co. for material needed to get the work started last Saturday. Mr. Bevens will probably need more cement or mortar mix from some supplier.

Mr. William H. Sellers delivered five hundred bricks last Saturday and promised to deliver five hundred more to the cemetery on Monday. We have the check for sixty dollars and will give it to him upon completion of delivery on Monday.

Now, Mr. Bevens says we will need another thousand bricks and he wants them delivered before next Saturday. Hence, his guess is now that it will take two thousand bricks to complete the work. We need to continue to search for another one thousand bricks, right away.
